

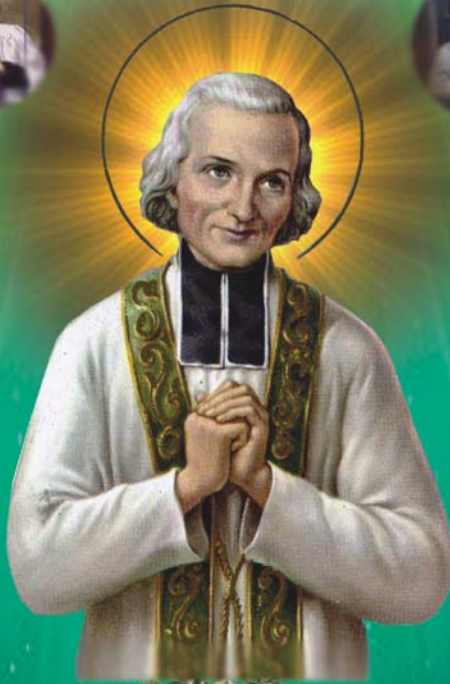

ARCHBISHOP'S MESSAGE



Liberty to the Captives

Reverend and dear Fathers, Brothers and Sisters, prayerful greetings to you in the Holy Name of our Lord Jesus Christ.

1. Liberty to the Captives: (Lk. 4:18)

“The spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he had anointed me to preach good news to the poor. He has sent me **to proclaim release to the captives**” Lk. 4:18; cf. Is 61:1 Jesus came into the world so that all human beings may have life and life in abundance (Jn. 10:10).

Luke, the Evangelist, enumerates the constitutive elements of the mission of Jesus Lk. 4:18-19. He places “**proclaiming release to the captives**” as one of the most important elements of the mission of Jesus. “Jesus went about all the cities and villages, preaching the gospel of the kingdom and healing every disease and infirmity” Mt. 9:36. He forgave the sins of people. Jesus, by his preaching and teaching, by his healing diseases and forgiving sins, fulfills the messianic expectations.

The parable of the shepherd and the lost sheep, the parable of the woman and the lost coin (Lk. 15:3-10) give us the beautiful message that the shepherd values his lost sheep and the woman values her lost coin and that they take every effort to go after the lost, search until they are found. Jesus has come into the world to seek out the lost and to find them; Jesus has come into the world to restore dignity to the humanity.

The church continues Christ’s mission of proclaiming release to the captives, through her various ministries and services. In our services to the captives, the offenders, the criminals we need to have the attitude and disposition of Jesus, the compassionate approach of Jesus. Jesus came into the world not to condemn the world but to save the world (Jn. 3:17). Jesus is the face of the merciful father. Jesus does not condemn the woman caught in adultery; he forgives her and admonishes her not to sin again (Jn. 8:11).

On 13th August 2017 we celebrate the **Prison Ministry Sunday**. There are more than 4 lakhs of prisoners in the 1401 prisons of India. All of them may not be guilty of crimes punishable according to the Indian penal code. The prisoners are not numbers to be counted; they are not questions to be answered; they are not problems to be solved; they are not cases to be studied. They are **human persons** to be valued, to be loved, to be respected, to be accepted and to be helped.

We look at the prisoners with the eyes of Christ; we love the prisoners with the heart of Christ. We express our concern for and solidarity with the prisoners. We try to visit them frequently and give them hope; we pray with them and for them. We do services to them and arrange special programmes for them with due permission. By our presence, prayers and services to the prisoners, we bring to them the healing presence of the Christ. Christ has identified himself with the prisoners. “I was in prison and you came to me” (Mt. 25:36).

The family members of the prisoners should be also supported emotionally and financially. Special attention needs to be paid for the formation and education of the children. Prevention is better than cure. By proper instructions to the youth and by imparting right value systems to them, crimes could be notably reduced in the society.

St. Maximilian Kolbe is the patron of the Prison Ministry, India. He himself was a prisoner. Imitating example of Christ, he offered his life for the sake of his fellow prisoner. May his life inspire us to love the prisoners and to serve them in all possible ways.

Mary, Refuge of sinners, pray for us.

2. New President of India

We are very happy that Mr. Ramnath Kovind had been elected and sworn in on 25th July 2017 as the 14th President of India. We offer our hearty felicitations to him pray for him and wish him success in his new office.

3. Black Day

The constitution (Schedule Caste) order 1950 was signed on 19th August 1950 by the President of India which says that **“No person who professes a religion other than Hinduism shall be deemed to be a member of the Schedule Caste”** which was later amended to include Sikhs (1956) and Buddhists (1990) in the Scheduled Caste net.

This order discriminates the Dalit Christians. Hence, we observe 10th of August as Black Day and demand that Dalit Christians be constitutionally granted Schedule Caste status.

4. New Secretaries

Rev. Fr. F. Henry Ezhil Maran is appointed as the New Secretary of the Bible Commission with effect from 01-08-2017 in the place of Rev. Fr. A. Benjamin. We thank Rev. Fr. A. Benjamin for his devoted services as the secretary of the Bible Commission for 10 years.

Rev. Fr. A. Arputharaj is appointed as the Secretary of Youth Commission with effect from 01-08-2017 in the place of Rev. Fr. S. Albert. We thank Rev. Fr. S. Albert for his devoted service for the past 6 years.

Making annual retreat is a serious obligation of the clergy (Can. 276/4). Hence, you are to make your own arrangements for your annual retreat, if you do not join the diocesan retreat.

Voice from Metropolitan Matrimonial Tribunal – 82

CHRISTIAN PARENTING

It is a natural desire of every young person to get married and to have a family. Parenting is an intrinsic part of a Catholic marriage. I hope married couples would recall that great day in their life, when they stood before the altar of God to administer the sacrament of matrimony to each other in the presence of the minister and two witnesses and a bevy of friends and relatives and duly blessed by God. Still more, I hope they remember the Minister asking them to hold their right hands and to state their intentions by asking them three questions. The third of the three questions is "Will you accept children from God". The mandatory response had to be "We will". If the couple answered in the negative, the minister is obliged to cancel the marriage. So parenting is an incumbent responsibility that every catholic married couple accepts along with their marriage.

Is parenting a source of joy or a burden? I am sure there could never be a single answer to this question. Parents of differing age groups will have different answers. Parenting is a responsibility of every married couple from the time of conception of a child till it reaches adulthood. After creation of Adam and Eve, God passed on the responsibility of transmitting life to human beings through their physical union. So we can be sure that God empowers every parent to accomplish a joyful parenthood. I would like to expound one aspect of parenting, with emphasis on the modern day situation and scenario.

Joint Spiritual Responsibility

Firstly, as a man and a woman have jointly contributed to conception of a child, it automatically follows that both father and mother have equal responsibility in nurturing the child. There could be different roles for each in accomplishing this task and they may vary even depending on circumstances. *In a Christian family the father is the priest, provider and protector, of the Head of the family. He is primarily responsible for bringing God to his family and taking his family to God. The mother on the other hand is the Heart of the family. She sets the emotional tone of the family, establishing the spiritual atmosphere, which enables the father to fulfill his task of being the priest of the family.*

Today we notice in majority of Christian families, these clear-cut and equally important roles have either been forgotten or abdicated. This is because the fathers have been concentrating on their roles of provider and protector and leaving the priestly duty of spiritual upkeep of the family to mothers, religious sisters and catechism teachers. Practically this means that it is the mothers who teach children prayers at home and also lead the family prayers (if any). This is supplemented in the Catechism class. While the children are still small, the mother is able to give spiritual formation by ensuring they participate in family prayers and church services. However, once the children reach teenage, the mother faces difficulty in fulfilling this task. Many fathers do

participate in family prayers but in a very passive way. Hence they are unable to command 'spiritual discipline' through regular prayers and attendance at Church services.

St. John Paul II lamented in one of his documents that the Catholic families have deteriorated spiritually and socially because men (fathers) have failed to carry out the God-given responsibility of being the spiritual head of the family.

In parenting the most basic and crucial responsibility is laying a strong spiritual foundation for the family, with the father taking the lead role and the mother ably and effectively supporting. If the father and mother jointly ensure that the children from their earliest age are introduced to 'personal prayer', scripture reading and daily family prayer, they will be absolutely capable of handling all other aspects of parenting.

Soon after marriage and well before the first child arrives, couples should discuss this joint spiritual responsibility and make out their plans for fulfilling the same. This is more important than the financial and material planning that many couples do in preparation for the arrival of their first child. Just as parents meticulously prepare the "baby's room" with colorful scenery or pictures, bay furniture etc. they should also decorate the baby room with spiritual articles and pictures of Baby Jesus, Mother Mary and angels. It would also be a good thing to play hymns and religious songs during the period of pregnancy as medical science has proved that the fetus, from the very second month, is able to absorb external noises and radio waves. St. Xavier’s Pastoral Centre

Biblical Tamil Cultural Research Centre

In our pastoral centre, we have constructed this Biblical Tamil Cultural Research Centre. On the 3rd July by 10.30 a.m. Our Archbishop along with the Vicar General, Procurator, Rev. Fr. A. Maria Selvam and some of the Vicariate Fathers came, blessed and inaugurated the centre. During the function, Fr. Maria Selvam gave an introduction explaining the utility of the centre. The bible commission of our Archdiocese can facilitate with necessary books in the field of scripture and Tamil Culture so that the interested people can make research to find out how Tamil Culture and Biblical Culture have enriched and complemented each other. This

is a new venture. We thank Fr Maria Selvam who is the pioneer and the master mind of this concept and the centre. We thank our beloved Archbishop and the diocesan administration, Velayudam Constructions and the Propagande Fide for their support, cooperation for its construction.

Informations**1. A Letter from the CBCI office for SC/BC – Appeal to Observe August 10th as Black Day (67 years of denial of Religious Freedom to Dalits in India)**

The Constitution (Scheduled Caste) order 1950 was signed on 10th August 1950 by the then President of India which says that “No person who professes a religion other than Hinduism shall be deemed to be a member of the Scheduled Caste” which was later amended to include Sikhs (1956) and Buddhists (1990) in the Scheduled caste net.

Civil Writ petition 180/2004 in the Honourable Supreme Court of India praying the deletion of paragraph 3 of the Constitution (Scheduled Caste) order 1950 is still pending for the past 13 years in which the CBCI and NCCI have also impleaded. The case had been referred to

a higher bench and still it has not been constituted. Thus Constitutional rights for Dalit Christians and Dalit Muslims are denied based on religion for the past 67 years.

To express our dissatisfaction about this 'Constitution Scheduled Caste order 1950 para 3 which is 'unconstitutional and it is a black letter written outside the Constitution introduced through the back door by an executive order (NCRLM Report). I request you to observe August 10th as the Black Day in your respective regions, dioceses and institutions. Meetings, rallies, demonstrations, hunger stick, submitting memoranda, candle vigils and other forms of demonstrations can be also organized in your area to show support and solidarity to the suffering Christians of Scheduled Caste Origin. Please make use of the media especially the social media to disseminate the news to the civil society. You are also encouraged to wear black badges on 10th August 2017 and display the posters on your notice boards. High-impact exercises like jogging or running can be painful for someone who's obese. However, swimming is an excellent alternative, since the resistance offered by the water will keep your heart rate up, without stressing your joints.

2. Cycling

Whenever the distance is realistic enough, you should try cycling instead of driving or taking public transport. This is both a fun and simple way of losing weight, while reducing harm to the environment.

3. Take the Stairs

Using the stairs instead of the elevator is a straightforward and passive way to lose weight without really thinking about it. Simply walking an additional ten to fifteen flights a day could leave quite an impact.

4. Commit to a Gym

Nobody likes to waste their money, so paying for a gym membership could be just the push you need to keep up your exercise habits.

5. Weight Training



Many people only stick to cardio when trying to lose weight, yet experts say that training with weights is just as important. By putting on some muscle mass, your body will have to spend calories to maintain it, instead of converting all those extra calories to fat.

6. Yoga

While helping to lower your stress levels and strengthen your core muscles, yoga has also been found to boost your metabolism and aid in fat loss.

How to Lose Fat Quickly

1. Water

Drinking more water will detoxify your body and also fill you up more. Drinking a glass of water before dinner can prevent overeating, and a glass of water is also an ideal substitute for a snack.

2. Eating Space

Designating just one space for eating (that isn't the kitchen), will make you less likely to snack at the wrong time. It will also be easier to keep track of your eating habits, and will help reduce your peripheral calorie intake.

4. Breakfast

Limiting your breakfast to no more than 400 calories will give you a much better chance of sticking to your daily calorie goals. Make sure that you consume some energy-dense foods to help you avoid snacking later on in the day. Ideal breakfast choices include salmon, avocado, eggs, and peanut butter.

5. Say 'Goodbye' to Fast Food

Fast foods and processed foods have an absurdly high concentration of calories and saturated fats, which can shatter your diet. Enjoy watching the pounds melt off as you run far away from these guilty pleasures.

6. Balance Your Nutrient Intake

Make sure that your diet consists of an even balance of carbs, protein, and fat. This will avoid any nutrient deficiencies, without harming your fat loss goals.

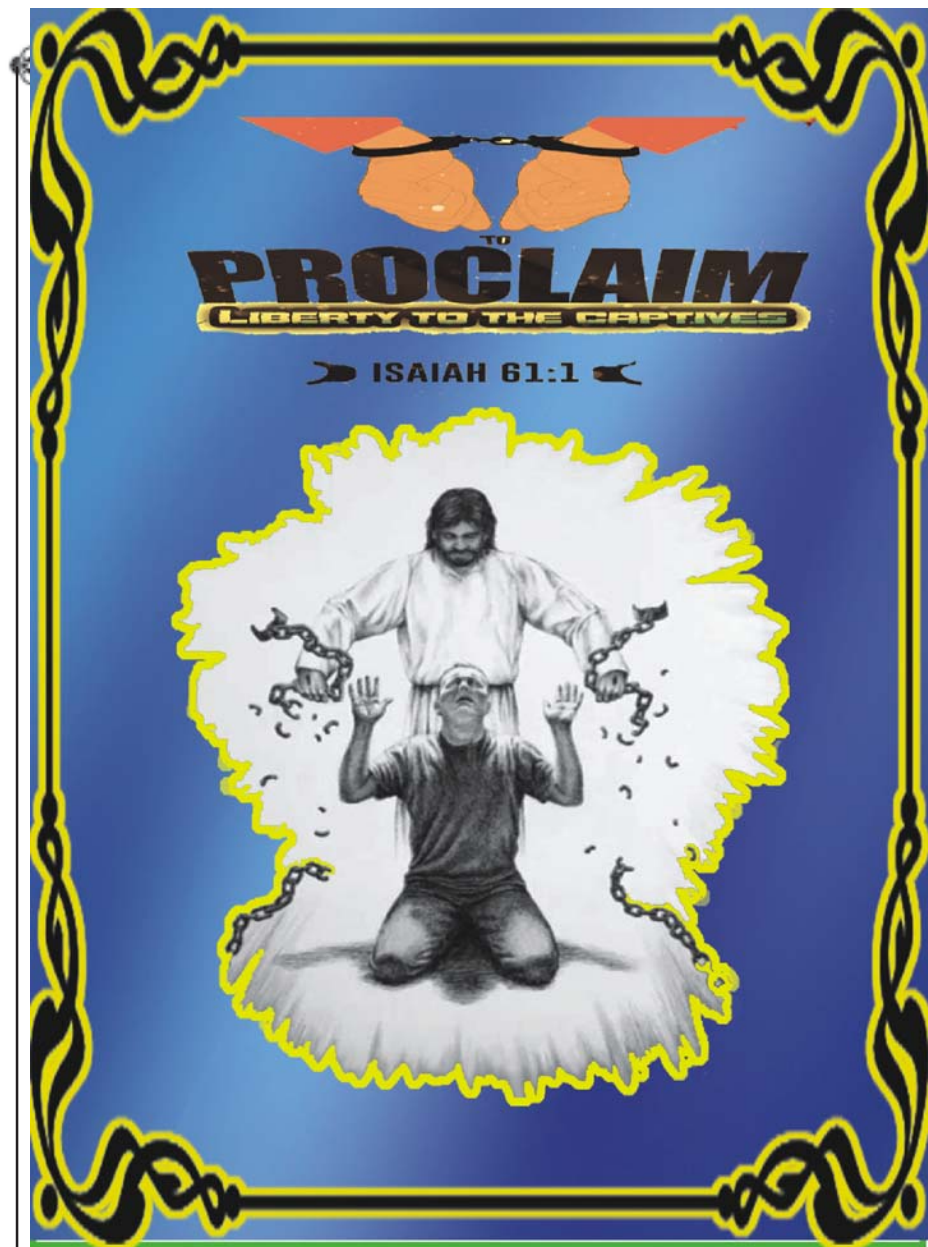
